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Faculty Development Starter Grant

This is a new funding mechanism we are rolling out, to be spent on additional time and resources to embark on, or start, a new academic project/direction. It is a very broad call open to faculty without other substantial external funding, including really any project that will enhance development along your career path, whether in pragmatic research, clinical innovation, leadership, education, etc.

It could be thought of as a cousin to the research starter grant and the Eleanor Miles Shore grant. The budget may cover additional academic

time, RA time, materials, etc. These projects can be of flexible size, duration and schedule of project (plan to fund 2-3/year). Brief 1-page letters of intent were due 10/1- we got a lot of amazing proposals! Thanks to all for the interest, and we hope that many of these great ideas can potentially be sponsored through other mechanisms.

Several were invited to submit the full 3-page applications, due 10/30.

Awardees will ultimately present their work to the department during Grand Rounds after completion of the project.

The idea would be to give this group monetary and logistical support to organize meetings (like having a group dinner or happy hour, catering in at an on-site meeting, etc., organizing doodle polls and zooms). We don't want to be too prescriptive but let the group decide what they want to do and let it develop organically.

The overall goal is to connect people who have similar interests and encourage collaboration and idea sharing across divisions, and help people develop their academic area of interest through information-sharing, mentorship, community, and sponsorship.

The Faculty Development team would like to welcome and spotlight some of the new faculty joining us.






